

The Glorious Resurrection of the Lord

Easter is the Holy day of all Holy days; it is the Resurrection of the body of our Lord and Savior from the dead. It is victory over death.

The following Hymn summarizes all we need to know about the Resurrection: "Christ has risen from the dead; He trampled death by death; He gave life to those who were dead by His Resurrection; He overcame death and brought everlasting life to the living and the dead. This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad."

From a non-Christian perspective, resurrection can mean rising again into life or prominence. It can also mean revival such as restoration to life, consciousness, etc. Hence, it is a phenomenon. It should be pointed out that the resurgence/revival are done by someone else or something else causes it.

Lenten Retreat with Bishop Gregory

On Saturday, March 2nd, Bishop Gregory Mansour of the Eparchy of St. Maron of Brooklyn led a Lenten Retreat at Our Lady of Lebanon Maronite Church in Washington, DC. The one-day retreat included a celebration of the Divine Liturgy, talks on the subject of **prayer**, an opportunity for confession, and more!

The Family of Saint Sharbel USA Lent 2024 Retreat

A group from the Family of Saint Sharbel, USA, attended a retreat with the **Maronite Monks of Adoration** at Most Holy Trinity Monastery in Massachusetts from Thursday, March 7th through Sunday, March 10, 2024.

During the retreat, Abbot Patrick, Fr. Robert, and Fr. Maron delivered talks with question and answer sessions on the transformative effect of fasting, the transformative effect of prayer and almsgiving, and awareness of vices and virtues. Participants also engaged in personal adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and attended the monks' liturgical services, including Morning Prayers (Safro), Divine Liturgy, Midday Prayers, Evening Prayers (Ramsho), and Night Prayers (Sotooro).

Saint George

Catholic Feast Day: April 23rd (supposed date of his martyrdom)

St. George was a Christian who lived in Lydda during the time of the Diocletian persecution, which was a mandated suppression of Christianity that took place in the Roman Empire during the reign of Diocletian (around the early 300s AD). Though it is difficult to obtain clear details about his life, St. George was known to be a Roman soldier martyred for his firm faith in the Lord, which he refused to renounce even when faced with death threats. According to popular legend, George slayed a dragon (really, a demon) that was terrorizing his people, and this is frequently how he is remembered and depicted in iconography. Symbolically, however, George's interaction with the dragon could be likened to the way he approached threats to Christianity in his time and place—with the courage of a holy soldier.







Every Tuesday at 8:00 PM ET, members of the Family of Saint Sharbel from various locations gather on Zoom to pray Ramsho, the evening prayer from the Maronite Liturgy of the Hours, in Arabic.
