

The Virgin Mary Throughout the History of the Church

As soon as the Christian religion spread, it became, when followers of the Jewish religion and pagan philosophies heard of it, the target of many attacks seeking to eliminate it and its believers. The early Christians faced various persecutions and deadly tortures, but they did not submit to humiliation. They defended their faith with the courage of opinion, the argument of proof, and the confidence of the believer, out of the certainty that the Holy Spirit is the one who teaches them what they use as evidence. This is evidenced by the large number of texts left by believers in defense of their faith in the first generations that we are dealing with, that is, from the Pentecostals until the early fifth century. But these texts, despite their abundance, did not address in detail the subject of the Virgin Mary; she was not then a subject of theological controversy and criticism. However, these historical circumstances do not prevent us from talking about Mary, because the Virgin is for the Christian faith like the heart in man, and because the Virgin is for the Christian faith like the heart in man, and because talking about the son inevitably leads to talking about the mother, especially since the basic logic of faith is the data provided by the Bible.



Saint Pamphilus of Caesarea

Feast Day: June 1st

St. Pamphilus of Caesarea, not to be confused with St. Pamphilus of Sulmona, was a Christian scholar and martyr who lived in the 3rd and early 4th century AD. Said to have been born in Beirut (modern-day Lebanon), St. Pamphilus was known for his love of knowledge and devotion to Christian education. He studied in Alexandria, a great center of learning in his time, and used his skills to develop a deep understanding of and appreciation for Sacred Scripture. Finally settling in Caesarea in modern-day Palestine, he taught others about the Bible and the Christian faith and attracted many disciples. He was martyred during the Diocletian persecution in the early 300s AD for his refusal to sacrifice to pagan idols or renounce Christ.



Who is Our Lady of Elige?

The image above titled "Our Lady of Elige" hangs in many Maronite churches and can even be found in some of the homes of the faithful. Yet where did it come from, and what makes it so popular? Read the article below to learn about the history and meaning of this well-known icon!

"This beautiful icon, also known as Our Lady of the Maronites, depicts the Virgin Mother supporting on her lap, the Child of her womb, Jesus Christ (a favorite theme of St. Ephrem). It was discovered at the Patriarchal Church of Elige, Lebanon and is dated around the 10th Century. After uncovering several diverse pictorial layers, this icon has been revealed and marks an historic event in the history of Syro-Maronite iconography. This painting continues the tradition initiated by the RABBULA manuscript of the 6th Century."





Every Tuesday at 8:00 PM ET, members of the Family of Saint Sharbel from various locations gather on Zoom to pray Ramsho, the evening prayer from the Maronite Liturgy of the Hours, in Arabic. Each week, a priest leads the celebration, cantors sing hymns, and lectors read Scripture passages.
